Course Description

The choral program explores choral music from a wide variety of cultures and time periods through study and performance. The core curriculum emphasizes the basics of vocal technique, sight-reading, musicianship, and music theory. Students participate in daily rehearsals and perform around 4 concerts during the school year.

Objectives

- To enjoy making music
- To learn musicianship through high quality music representing diverse styles and eras.
- To emphasize the development of singing and music reading skills.
- To instill value of effort, cooperation, fellowship, dedication, and excellence.
- To create a supportive environment where students build selfconfidence through success.
- To enable students to become lifelong participants in the arts!

Classroom Materials

- **Pencil** Students should have a sharpened pencil at the beginning of each class. Music should be <u>marked in pencil only</u>.
- **Binders** Students will receive a black binder to be kept at school. If students are asked to practice at home (or they want to), they can take music home. Otherwise, students are encouraged to leave their music at school.
- **Zipper Pencil pouch for binder-** *preferred*. This is not required, but very helpful.
- **Choral Music-** Students will be given choral music belonging to Rossview High School that will be returned after the class is done learning the song. Students are responsible for music, just as they are responsible for textbooks in other classes. The student will pay for lost or damaged music. Each song averages around \$3.50.

Uniforms

Students will borrow performance apparel to wear for our choir concerts. This raises the level of professionalism in what we do and helps unify us as a team. Students will receive a uniform in a garment bag to take home before performances. The uniform is to be returned after each performance.

Students will need a pair of black closed toe dress shoes to wear for performances. Students that wear pants for their uniform will also need black socks. Please let me know if there is a financial difficulty. I recommend students wear a belt with the black pants.

Students are not to wear hats, scarfs or other accessories and jewelry during performances.

Please wash after each performance. Everything can be washed in the washing machine. I recommend hanging the dress to dry. Please iron the shirt if it appears wrinkled.

Remember to wear deodorant for performances, but please do not wear cologne or perfume. These fragrances can irritate allergies when we are standing in close proximity to others and taking deep breaths for singing.



Rehearsal Expectations

The choral rehearsal is a positive and productive academic environment. Our rehearsals are based on high expectations, positive attitudes, self-discipline, and goal-oriented learning. Student behavior during school classes and at public performances reflects on both Rossview and the Choral Department.

Our choir room is a safe space for students to create something amazing together through music. I want you to be able to participate fully knowing that you can share your voice with us in a respectful environment. It takes all of us working together. Every single student is important. Thank you in advance for treating your classmates with *kindness* and *respect*. This looks like cheering one another on, giving your best effort, listening while others are talking, being a good audience member, and working together for the good of the whole.

I ask that you bring an open mind and positive attitude to class! Our choir will be able to create incredible music this year with your hard work. Excellence is never an accident. It is the result of high intention, sincere effort, intelligent direction, and skillful execution.

Rehearsal Procedures

- 1. Get out choir folder and pencil from cabinet.
- 2. Students put all other personal belongings away.
- 3. Read announcements on the board
- 4. When the bell rings, students are to be quiet and ready to begin class.
- 5. Pick up trash, straighten chairs, and gather belongings and exit when excused.

 - Raise your hand to speak
 - Be kind to your classmates and treat everyone with respect



- Be in your seat with materials ready before the bell rings
- Bring a pencil and music to class

- Stay on task during rehearsal
- Don't work on other classwork during rehearsal
- KEEP CONTROL
 - Keep your hands and feet to yourself
 - Listen while Mrs. Waugh or others are talking
 - Keep your cell phone put away

Grading

Students' grades are based on their participation, performance, music preparation, and other assignments. Participation and performance are vital components to student's music education because it is how we learn and demonstrate our growth.

As a performance-based class, attendance at all performances and dress rehearsals are mandatory and graded.

Concert dates will be given at the beginning of the year and are an important assessment and significant part of a student's grade. All students work together for the benefit of the group. There will be around four performances throughout the year.

Call times for the concerts are usually about 45 minutes to an hour before the performance time. The scheduled call time is when rehearsal and warm up begins, therefore students should arrive in concert apparel at least 5 minutes early to be ready for roll call. Tardiness has an adverse effect on concert grades with 1% taken off for each minute late. Call times are for students only – no parents or friends in the audience please while we are warming up and rehearsing.

In the unlikely event that a concert is missed, a student may complete a make-up assignment. Students have one week from the day it is given to complete the make-up assignment in which students will record themselves performing the concert music and complete a written component to be given by the director. If you know ahead of time that you have a conflict with a concert date, discuss this as soon as possible.

Performance is a privilege, and the director can prohibit a student from performing if they fail to meet classroom requirements of professionalism and/or musical preparation. If a student is prohibited from performing, attendance at the concert will be required along with a written critique of the concert.

Rehearsal Participation = 35%

Students will be assessed on their classroom participation including effort, having required materials, active participation, rehearsal decorum, etc. See rubric below.

Homework/Assessment = 30%

Students will complete work in class to build their reading skills, reflect through listening logs, guided notes, marking in their music, etc. Students will have performance assessments to show growth in their sight-reading and music from class.

Performances = 35%

Performance grades include concert and dress rehearsal performance attendance and participation.

Choir Daily Participation Rubric

Students earn 5 points per category for a total of 15 points per day.
